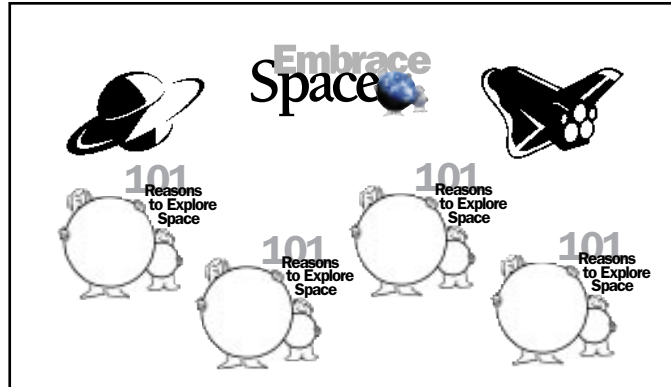


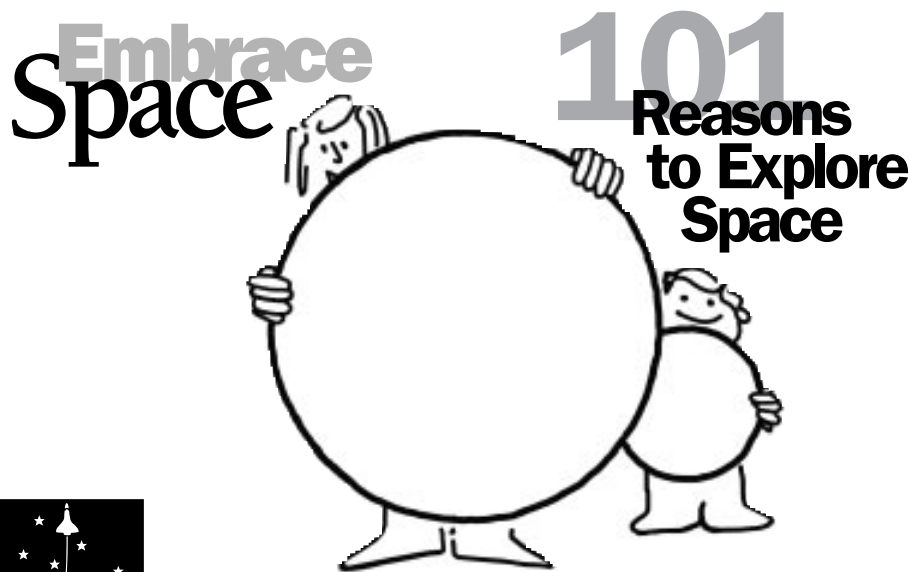
101 Reasons to Explore Space
